GENERAL ACTIVITY OUTCOMES

OF THE CENTER FOR EMERGENCY SITUATIONS AND DISASTER RISK REDUCTION

(THE CENTER)

1. **The process of establishment and institutionalization of the Center as a permanent intergovernmental body is completed**, to provide effective mechanisms for reduction emergency risks and mitigating their consequences and to deliver joint response through coordinated interstate measures stimulating regional and international cooperation.
2. The Center has developed and implemented:
 - ◆ *Strategic directions of activity Center for Emergency Situations and Disaster Risk Reduction until 2030, approved By decision of the Council of the Center in 2017;*
 - ◆ *Capacity Development Strategy for the Center for Emergency Situations and Disaster Risk Reduction for 2019-2021, approved by the decision of the Council of the Center in 2019.*
3. The Center has established and is currently implementing regional and international cooperation in the field of disaster risk reduction, prevention and elimination of emergency situations:
 - ◆ *With emergency departments, diplomatic missions and other competent authorities of more than 25 countries;*
 - ◆ *With more than 60 donor and financial institutions, UN Agencies, international and non-governmental organizations, scientific and educational institutions.*
4. The Center concluded **31 Memorandum (Letters of Agreements, Contracts)** on mutual understanding and cooperation with international and non-governmental organizations, scientific and educational institutions, within which joint programs, projects and plans are initiated and implemented in the field of disaster risk reduction, adaptation to climate change, prevention and elimination of emergency situations.
5. In addition to the official status of a permanent interstate body, the Center has been delegated the following statuses:
 - ◆ *Secretariat of the Regional Forum - Meeting of the Heads of Emergency Authorities of Central Asia countries;*
 - ◆ *Regional Resource Center of the Regional Platform for DRR for monitoring the Action Plan for the Implementation of the Sendai Framework for DRR for 2015-2030. in the region of Central Asia and the South Caucasus”.*
 - ◆ *The Center was given the status of an affiliated member of the International Civil Defense Organization (ICDO);*
6. At the initiative of the Center six high-level international events were organized and held:
 - ◆ *In March 2017 in the city of Dushanbe - Regional meeting of the Heads of Emergency Authorities of Central Asia countries on DRR within the framework of the Dialogue "Central Asia plus Japan", chaired by the Tajik side;*
 - ◆ *In April 2018 in the city of Almaty - Regional Forum - Meeting of the Heads of Emergency Authorities of Central Asia countries, chaired by the Kazakh side;*
 - ◆ *In July 2019 in the city of Bishkek - Regional Forum - Meeting of the Heads of Emergency Authorities of Central Asia countries, chaired by the Kyrgyz side;*
 - ◆ *In December 2020 in the city of Bishkek - Regional Consultative Meeting on strengthening regional cooperation in the field of disaster risk reduction and the implementation of the Sendai Program for DRR in Central Asia, chaired by the Kyrgyz side;*
 - ◆ *In November 2021, in the city of Tashkent - Regional Forum - Meeting of Heads of Emergency Authorities of Central Asia countries, chaired by the Uzbek side.*
 - ◆ *In October 2022, in the city of Dushanbe - Regional Forum - Meeting of the Heads of Emergency Authorities of Central Asia countries, chaired by the Tajik side.*
7. At the initiative of the Center with the technical and financial support of international organizations, eleven meetings were organized and held **working group (experts) Regional Forum - Meetings of Heads of Emergency Authorities of Central Asia countries:**

8. At the initiative of the Center By the decision of the Council of the Center in 2018, the Unified Register of Forces and Means of the Republic of Kazakhstan and the Kyrgyz Republic was formed to carry out rescue operations on their territory in case of emergencies, as well as measures are being taken to create a Regional Coordination Mechanism for responding to emergencies.
9. At the initiative of the Center Decisions Regional Forum - Meeting of the Heads of Emergency Departments of the Central Asian countries:
- ◆ *Established, and with the organizational and technical support of the Center, launched the activities of the Regional Scientific and Technical Council for Emergency Situations;*
 - ◆ *The Regional Register of experts in the field of Civil Protection / Defense, disaster risk reduction, prevention and elimination of emergency situations was formed;*
 - ◆ ***Approved Regulations on the Regional Forum - Meeting of the Heads of Emergency Departments of the Central Asian Countries;***
 - ◆ ***Approved Framework for Strengthening Regional Cooperation among Central Asian Countries in the field of disaster risk reduction, prevention and elimination of emergency situations.***
 - ◆ ***Approved Strategy for the development of cooperation between the countries of Central Asia in the field of disaster risk reduction for 2022-2030.***
 - ◆ ***Approved Regulation "On the Regional Mechanism emergency response coordination.***
 - ◆ ***Approved Plan of practical activities (roadmap) for the implementation Strategies for the development of cooperation between the countries of Central Asia in the field of disaster risk reduction for 2022-2023.***
 - ◆ ***Concept approved the use of unmanned aerial aircraft in order to reduce the risk of disasters, prevent and eliminate emergency situations in the countries of Central Asia.***
 - ◆ *The Regional Characteristics (Profile) of Disaster Risk of the Central Asian Countries Approved.*
 - ◆ ***Approved Action plan (Roadmap) for the implementation of the Strategy for the development of cooperation between the countries of Central Asia in the field of disaster risk reduction for 2023-2024.***

10. At the initiative of the Center with the technical and financial support of the World Bank, 16 meetings were organized and held Regional Scientific and Technical Council for Emergency Situations on strengthening regional scientific and technical cooperation in the field of DRR, AIC

and emergencies within the framework of the program "Strengthening financial resilience and accelerating disaster risk reduction in Central Asia", in December 2019, November 2020, December 2020 January 2021, June 2021, September 2021, November 2021 - 4 events, January 2022, February 2022, March 2022, July 2022, October 2022, March 01, 2023.

11. By attracting investments in the form of grant funds from donor agencies and international organizations, as an executing agency or partner, the Center has implemented or is currently implementing 36 projects in the field of strengthening regional cooperation, disaster risk reduction, adaptation to climate change and emergency situations (with with a total budget of more than 6 million US dollars):
- 1) **UNDRR Project** "Strengthening regional cooperation and facilitation of the implementation of the Sendai Program in Central Asia." The project budget is 149,834 US dollars. Implementation period: 2019-2022;

The project budget is 2,450 US dollars. Implementation period: 2018;

12. At the initiative of the Center, organizational support was created for the work of the Working Group of Experts of the CoES of the Ministry of Internal Affairs of the Republic of Kazakhstan and the Ministry of Emergency Situations of the Kyrgyz Republic to implement joint coordinated measures to integrate early warning systems for earthquakes in the Republic of Kazakhstan and the Kyrgyz Republic. 3 meetings of the joint working group of the Ministry of Emergency Situations of the Republic of Kazakhstan, the Ministry of Emergency Situations of the Kyrgyz Republic and the Center were held on May 21, 2020, February 09, 2021 and May 18, 2021 in Bishkek on the basis of the Central Asian Institute of Applied Geosciences.

A technical working group has been set up to develop **Regional system of early warning and mutual information about the threat and occurrence of emergencies.**

13. On the initiative Since 2018, the Center and ICDO have been provided with organizational support to establish cooperation and interaction **diving services of Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan**, to improve the skills of cytological services of emergency departments of the countries of Central Asia. In 2021, with the direct support of the Center and the ICDO, the diving service of the Ministry of Emergency Situations of the Kyrgyz Republic and the Russian Federation conducted trainings to improve the skills of diving services specialists of the CoES of the Ministry of Internal Affairs of the Republic of Kazakhstan on the basis of a water rescue station in the city of Priozersk, Kazakhstan. Based on the results of the training, 25 rescue divers were awarded international certificates of the IGO and qualification documents of divers of 1-2 groups, 10 divers were awarded international certificates "Master Trainer", which in the future will be able to train their colleagues as trainers. In addition, the Republican Rescuer Training Center in Priozersk is certified by the ICDO and received the status of an international rescuer training center. In 2022 based on training ground "Rock City - Astana "ten-day master training for canine services of emergency departments of Central Asian countries. In 2023, on the basis of the training ground "Rock City - Astana", as part of the first stage of the international gathering-seminar "Kazkutkaru - 2023", the Center successfully conducted a master training for cytological services of the countries of Central Asia with the technical and financial support of the IGO. According to the results of the master training, 41 rescue dog handlers from Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan were awarded certificates of the International Civil Defense Organization. In addition, in 2023, on the basis of the training ground "Rock City - Astana", as part of the first stage of the international gathering-seminar "Kazkutkaru-2023" The Center, with the technical and financial support of the ICDO, successfully conducted a master training on the use of unmanned aircraft for emergency situations. According to the results of the master training, 51 unmanned aerial vehicle operators from Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan,

Tajikistan and Uzbekistan were awarded international certificates, while two trainers of the Center were awarded certificates of the IGO "Professional Trainer of the Course "Using UAVs for Emergency Tasks".

14. The Center, in May-June 2020, coordinated with the CoES of the Ministry of Internal Affairs of the Republic of Kazakhstan and assisted the Red Crescent of Kazakhstan in providing humanitarian assistance to the population of the Turkestan region of the Republic of Kazakhstan affected by the flood that occurred as a result of a dam break in the Sardoba reservoir of the Republic of Uzbekistan.
15. The Center, together with UNICEF in the Republic of Kazakhstan, is conducting a number of activities to develop unmanned aircraft in order to ensure the safety of territories and the population, taking into account the interests of vulnerable groups. Established zonal emergency response teams using UAV capabilities. In 2023, a number of activities were carried out to strengthen the capacity of the non-governmental sector of the Republic of Kazakhstan in the field of basic obligations for children during humanitarian actions, coordination of actions in emergencies and planning for the provision of services in emergencies.
16. The Center regularly organizes and carries out work on collection, compilation, analysis and exchange of operational information in the field of emergency situations through the development and communication to stakeholders of the daily "Operational information on emergency situations in the countries of Central Asia".
17. From March 2020 to April 2022, the Center carried out work on collection, synthesis, analysis and exchange of information on the situation, problems, needs and requests of the Central Asian countries to respond to and eliminate the consequences of the spread of the coronavirus COVID-19 at the national and regional levels, including through:
 - ◆ *Development and communication to stakeholders of the daily "Up-to-date information on the situation with the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic in the countries of Central Asia";*
 - ◆ *Holding regular Regional consultative and advisory meetings with representatives of regional and subregional offices of international and non-governmental organizations to discuss issues reducing the risk of disasters, emergencies and the COVID-19 pandemic in the countries of Central Asia.*
18. The Center, together with international and non-governmental organizations, scientific institutions, with their technical and financial support, for the period from 2016 to July 2023, prepared and held 182 international events (conferences, forums, seminars, trainings, meetings, meetings ...) in the field of disaster and emergency risk reduction.

(Indicative costs of donor agencies, international and non-governmental organizations for the preparation and holding of the above international events amounted to more than 2 million US dollars).

6168 people took part in these events, exchanged experience, gained new knowledge, improved their skills in the field of disaster risk reduction and emergency situations, including:

- ◆ *2300 representatives of the Republic of Kazakhstan;*
 - ◆ *598 representatives of the Kyrgyz Republic;*
 - ◆ *736 representatives of the Central Asian countries and other states;*
 - ◆ *280 representatives of scientific institutions and independent experts;*
 - ◆ *2254 representatives of international and non-governmental organizations.*
19. The Center, together with partners, developed and posted on the Center's website, and also transferred for practical use to the emergency departments of the Central Asian countries, international and non-governmental organizations, scientific and educational institutions more than 60 research, analytical, methodological developments, educational, methodological, informational and reporting materials in the field of DRR and emergency situations.
