BACKGROUND OF THE CENTER'S ESTABLISHMENT:

2005: Kazakhstan first initiated a proposal to establish a Central Asian Center for emergency situations at the second World Conference for disaster risk reduction in Kobe (Japan)

17th May, 2013: In Almaty, the Heads of the Ministries for emergency situations of the Republic of Kazakhstan and the Kyrgyz Republic signed the Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Kazakhstan and the Government of the Kyrgyz Republic on establishment of the Center for Emergency Situations and Disaster Risk Reduction (hereinafter - Center)



The Center has been opened and has been operating since **14th September, 2016**

THE CENTER'S MISSION:

THE CENTER AIMS TO:

- ensure an efficient mechanism for disaster risk mitigation;
- reduction of its consequences;
- joint response through activities agreed by the Parties;
- stimulate regional and international cooperation.

STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS OF THE CENTER'S ACTIVITIES:

1. Strengthening regional and international cooperation in DRR, emergency prevention and elimination.
2. Raising public safety and territories of the countries in the region.
3. Consolidation of efforts of all stakeholders and attraction of investments in DRR, prevention of emergency situations.
4. Strengthening the preparedness for effective response to emergencies, carrying out rescue and humanitarian operations, reconstruction and rehabilitation.

The Center is open for joining the other countries. At present, the issue of becoming **Uzbekistan** a state member of the Center is under the active consideration.

THE CENTER' FUNDING:

THE REGIONAL FORUM – MEETING OF THE HEADS OF EMERGENCY AUTHORITIES OF CENTRAL ASIAN COUNTRIES:

During a series of Regional Ministerial conferences held in Central Asian countries in 2013-2015, a permanent high-level consultative platform in the format of the **Regional Forum - Meeting of the Heads of Emergency Authorities of Central Asian Countries** was established.

Main functions of the Regional Forum:

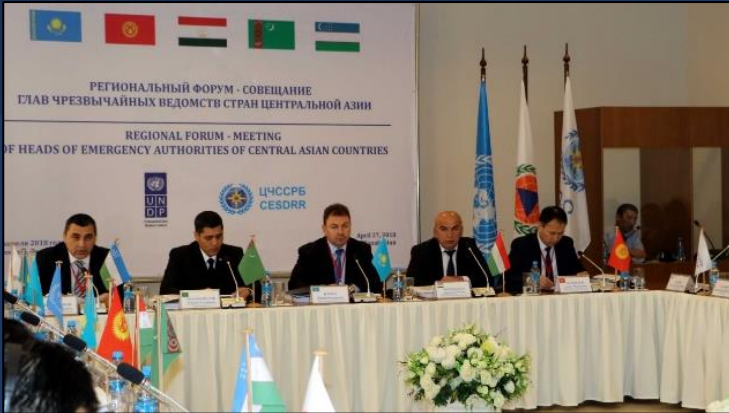
-● Creation of an **auxiliary mechanism** for strengthening and developing the regional cooperation in DRR, prevention and elimination of emergencies;
-● **Assisting in strengthening the potential for DRR**, emergency prevention and response at the regional and national levels;
-● **Capacity building of experts and specialists** of Emergency Authorities by exchange of experience, training, workshops, exercises, and other activities;
-● Formulation of proposals and recommendations for the consideration and harmonization of analytical and methodological materials, and the use of international terminology.

The Secretariat of the Regional Forum is the Center.

The working body of the Regional Forum is the Working group of the Regional Forum.

Поддерживая усилия Организации Объединённых Наций и других международных организаций в области снижения риска бедствий, адаптации к изменению климата, оказания международной помощи в случае чрезвычайных ситуаций, исходя из глобальных Целей устойчивого развития до 2030 года, приоритетов и принципов Сендайской рамочной программы по снижению риска бедствий на 2015–2030 гг.,

Поддерживая призыв Генерального секретаря ООН, озвученный во время 7-й сессии Глобальной платформы по снижению риска бедствий (Индонезия, 23-28 мая 2022 года) по обеспечению защиты каждого человека на Земле путем охвата всего населения системами раннего оповещения и взаимного информирования об угрозе возникновения чрезвычайных ситуаций,

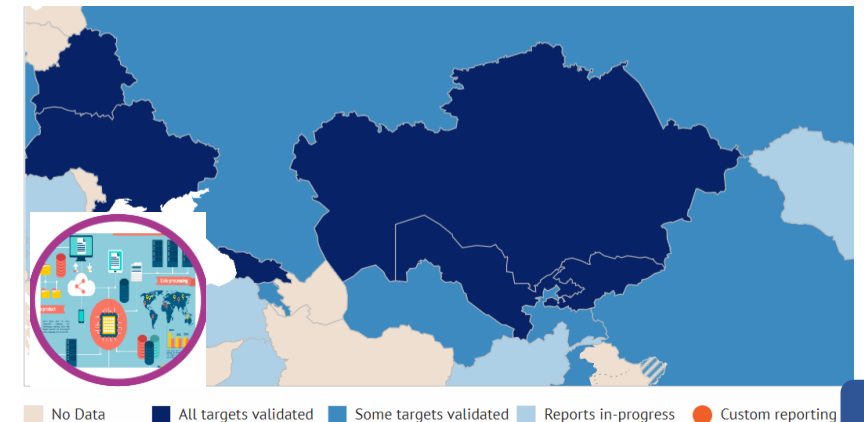


The Center is a Regional Resource Center of Sendai Framework for DRR 2015-2030

- Within the period from 2020 to 2023 - **21** trainings were held for Sendai national and technical focal points of CA countries on the implementation of Sendai Monitor indicators

- As a result of the trainings, all Central Asian countries submit national reports in the Sendai Monitor System in a timely manner
- The Center provides logistical support for the development of the National Disaster Loss Accounting System (**DesInventar-Sendai**)



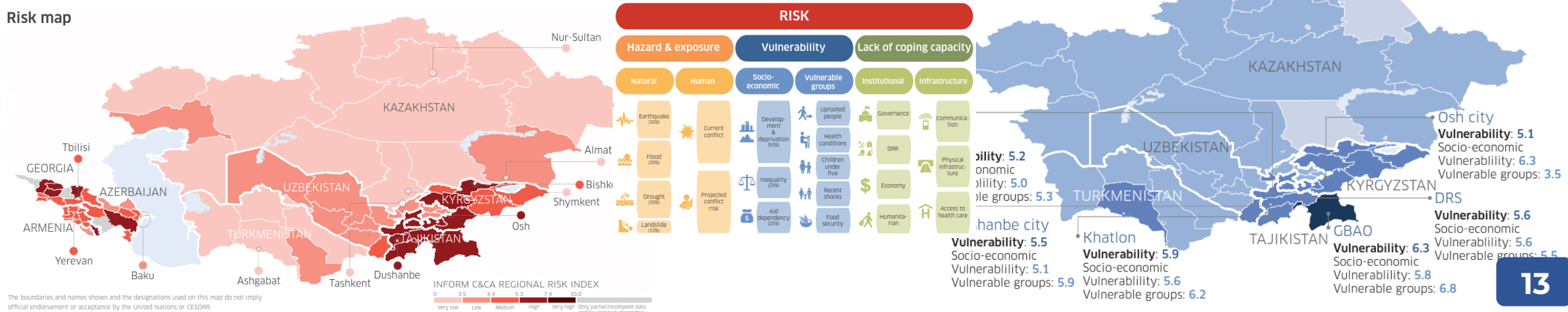
INFORM Index Risk

Caucasus and Central Asia: Subnational INFORM risk

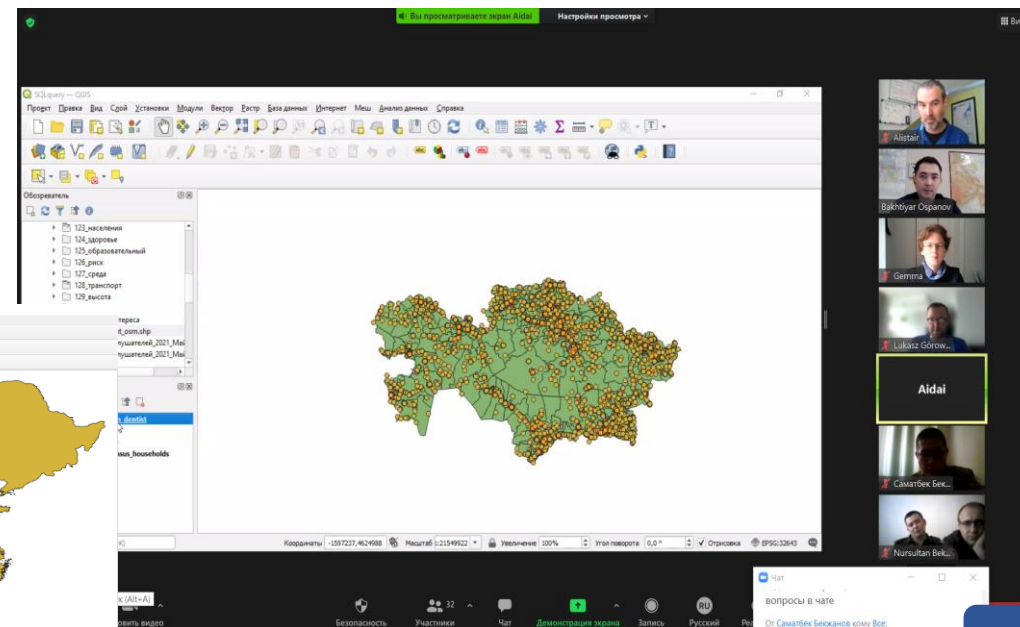
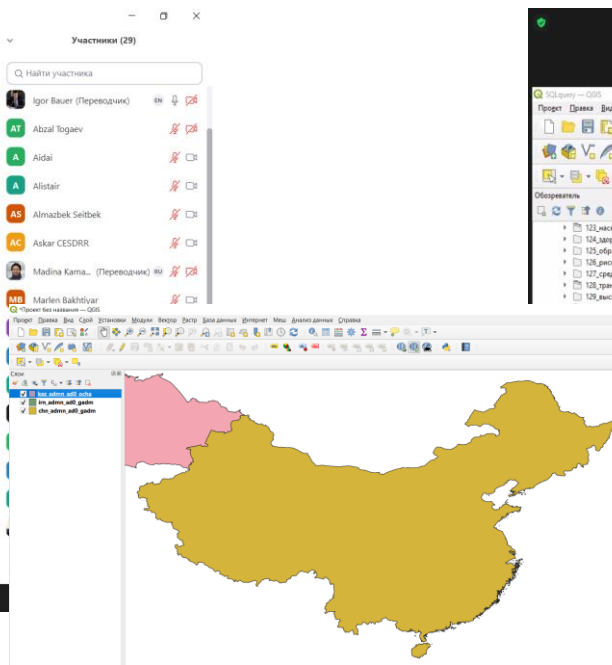
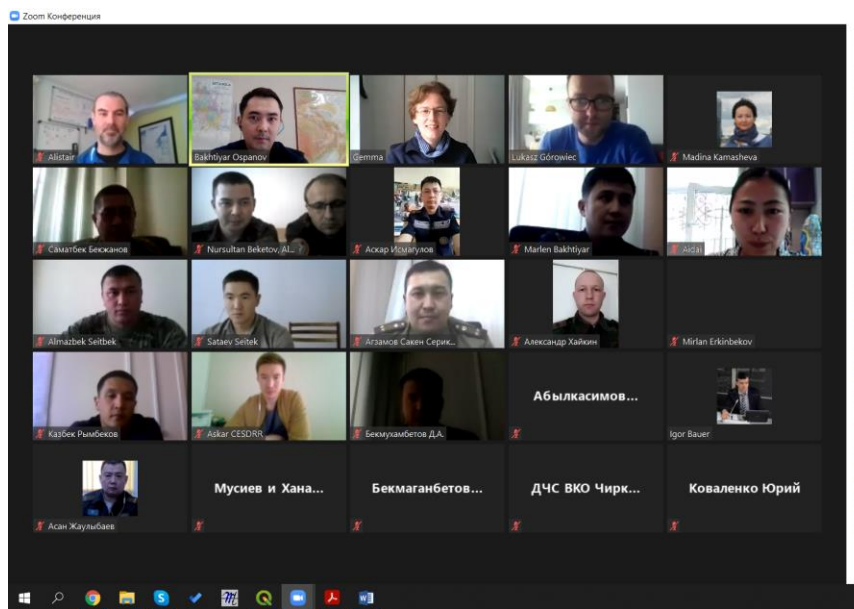
Risk map





MapAction - Advanced training on the application of GIS technologies and mapping in emergencies for officers of MES RK and MES KR

In the period from 2018 to 2023 **11** trainings were held, more than **260** officers of Ministries for Emergency Situations of Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan were trained.



REGIONAL SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL COUNCIL:



- RSTC was formed by the Decision of the Regional Forum with the organizational and technical support of the Center.
- RSTC is a public expert and advisory body of the Regional Forum, formed to facilitate in strengthening regional scientific and technical cooperation between Emergency Authorities of Central Asian Countries, international and non-governmental organizations, scientific and educational institutions in DRR, disaster prevention and response.
- RSTC consists of 3 representatives-experts from each country, delegated by the Emergency Authorities of Central Asian countries.

- ✓ In total – **15 meetings** were conducted within the frame of the **World Bank** Program “Strengthening Financial Resilience and Accelerating Risk Reduction in Central Asia”, funded by the European Union.
- ✓ Based on the results of the meeting, a protocol is drawn up, the decisions of which are advisory.

REGIONAL REGISTER OF EXPERTS (49 PERS.) IN DRR, CIVIL DEFENSE, DISASTER PREVENTION AND RESPONSE IS:

- Approved by the Decision of the Regional Forum-the Meeting of the Heads of Emergency Authorities of CA countries.
- Formed to involve national and international experts in the implementation of regional scientific and technical projects, conducting expert and analytical researches, developing methodical documents, scientific and technical recommendations on the application of scientific and innovation achievements in DRR

Main tasks of the Regional Register of Experts:

- involvement of leading scientists and specialists in conducting objective and competent expert and analytical researches;
- ordering of statistics, analysis and control of the deliverables of expert and analytical activities of experts of The Regional Register of Experts;
- formulation of suggestions, implementation of measures to improve the effectiveness of expert and analytical activities towards authorized state bodies, international and non-governmental organizations in the field of civil defense, DRR, disaster prevention and response.

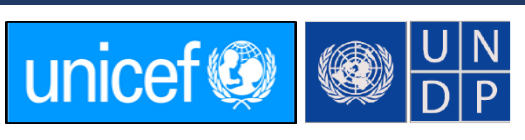

ICDO - Master training for rescue divers of MES of Kazakhstan



- The Training program was harmonized with international standards
- Training course of the Training Center for rescue divers of MES RK was certified and added to the ICDO Register
- 35 rescue divers of MES RK were trained
- 25 divers were awarded ICDO certificates of the international standard and their class qualification was improved
- 10 divers were awarded ICDO certificates of the international standard “Master trainer” and their class qualification was improved





ICDO – Series of Advanced training for canine services of Emergency Authorities of Central Asian countries

2022



- Experienced canine trainers from the Russian Federation were invited
- Cynologists have worked out the technique of using rescue dogs in search and rescue operations on a man-made blockage and in the natural environment
- 77 cynologists from MES of Kazakhstan, MES of Kyrgyzstan, CES of Tajikistan and MES of Uzbekistan were trained
- Upon completion of training, rescue cynologists were awarded international standard certificates

Rescue operations in Türkiye



Of the **12** canine units of the Central Asian countries that participated in the rescue operation in Türkiye, **5** units took part in the advanced training in 2022, which eventually helped save **38** people alive and retrieve the bodies of **682** dead from the rubble.



ICDO – Advanced Training on the use of UAVs for Emergency Management



- The International trainers of ICDO and CESDRR acted as trainers
- 51 drone operators from MES of Kazakhstan, MES of Kyrgyzstan, CoES of Tajikistan and MES of Uzbekistan attended the training
- Within the framework of the training, competitions were held among participants in three disciplines: "Crossing the track with obstacles in the minimum time", "Delivery of a small-sized cargo to the victim" and "Night rescue operation"
- Upon completion of training, drone operators were awarded international standard certificates

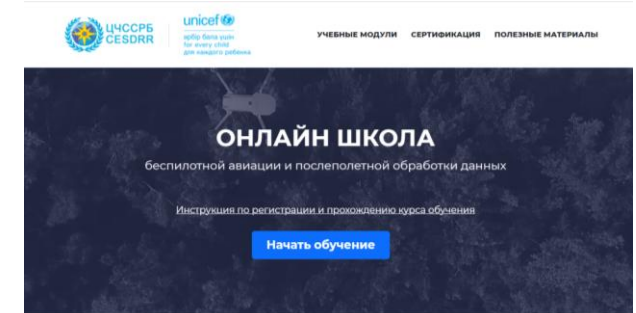
- The Zonal emergency response units using the UAV's were created in a test mode.
- In 2021 Zonal emergency response units participated in **3** rescue operations and **6** monitoring activities of flood, mudflow and avalanche areas.
- In total, Zonal emergency response units made 192 flights, with total duration of 108 hours, were surveyed 138,5 km²



- Series of training were conducted, more than **130** officers of Emergency Authorities of Central Asian countries improved their skills and knowledge in the field of UAVs application in emergencies.



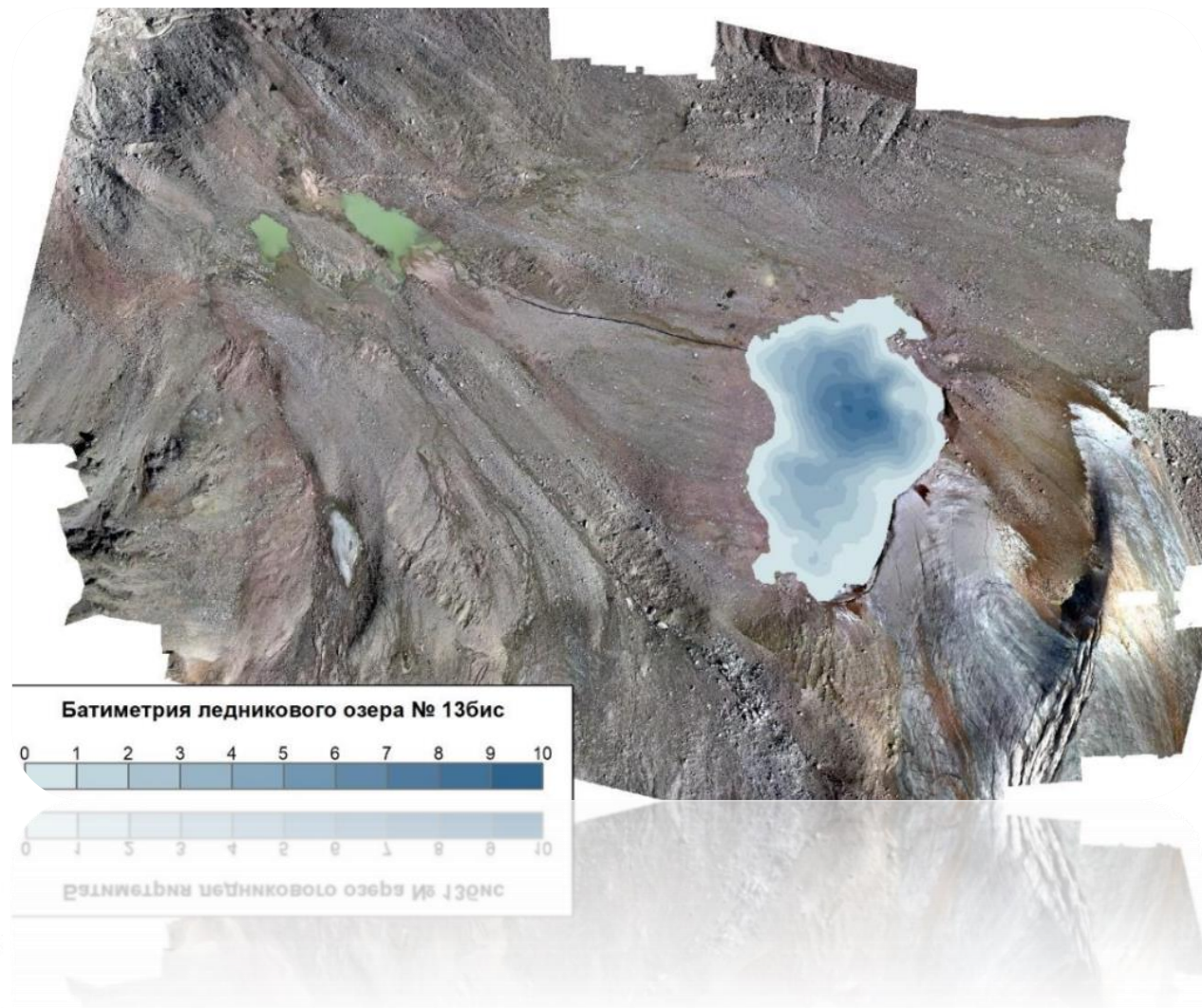
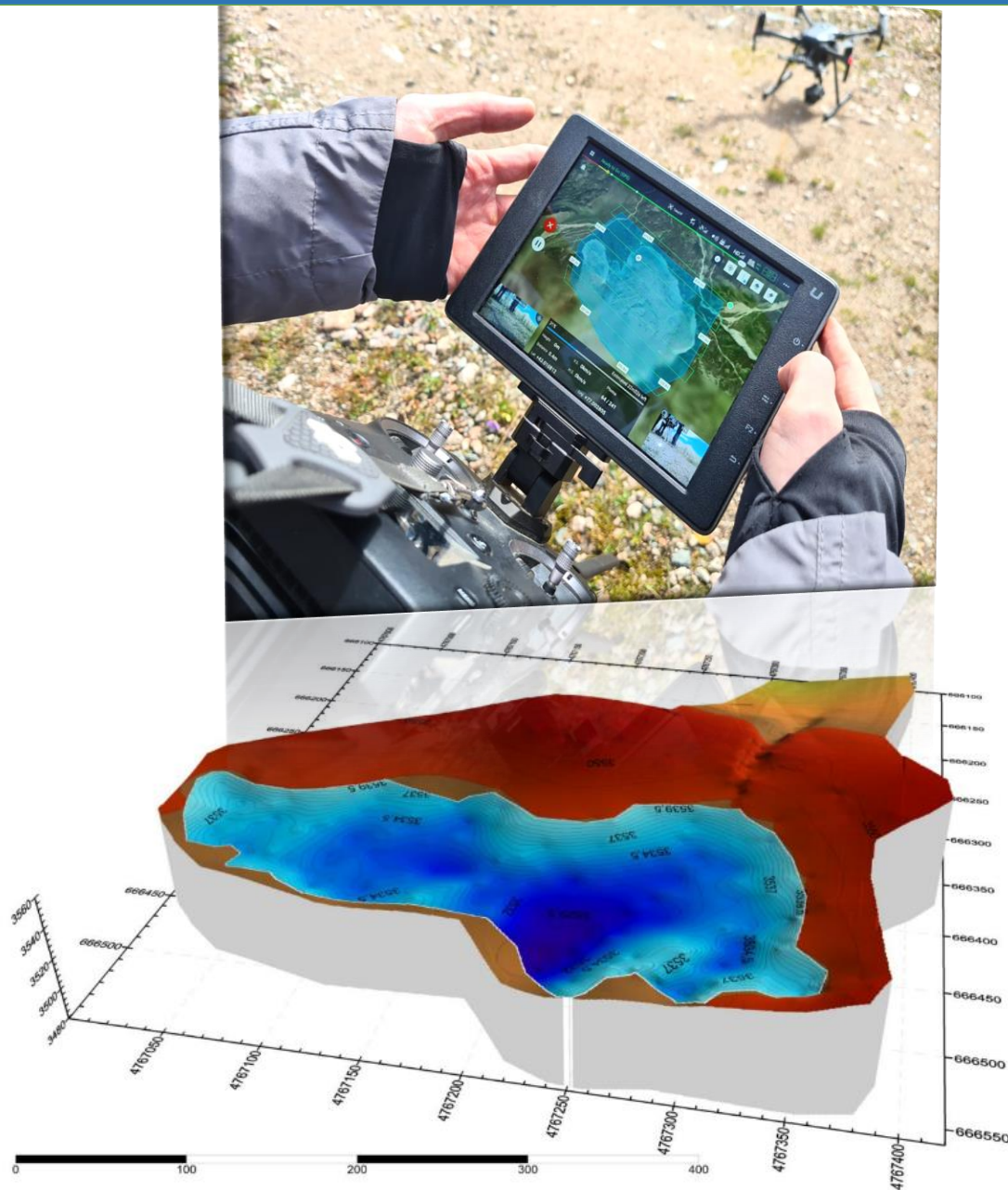
- A unique product has been created in Central Asia - the Online School of Unmanned Aviation - is the only remote tool in the region for training specialists in the use of UAVs for civil protection tasks
- At the early stage – 5 Regional Emergency Departments had own unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs), later – **12** Regional Departments.
- Number of UAVs– before - 9, currently – **24**.

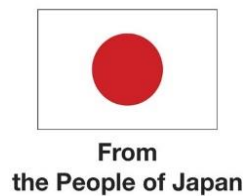

3D terrain models, developed within the project





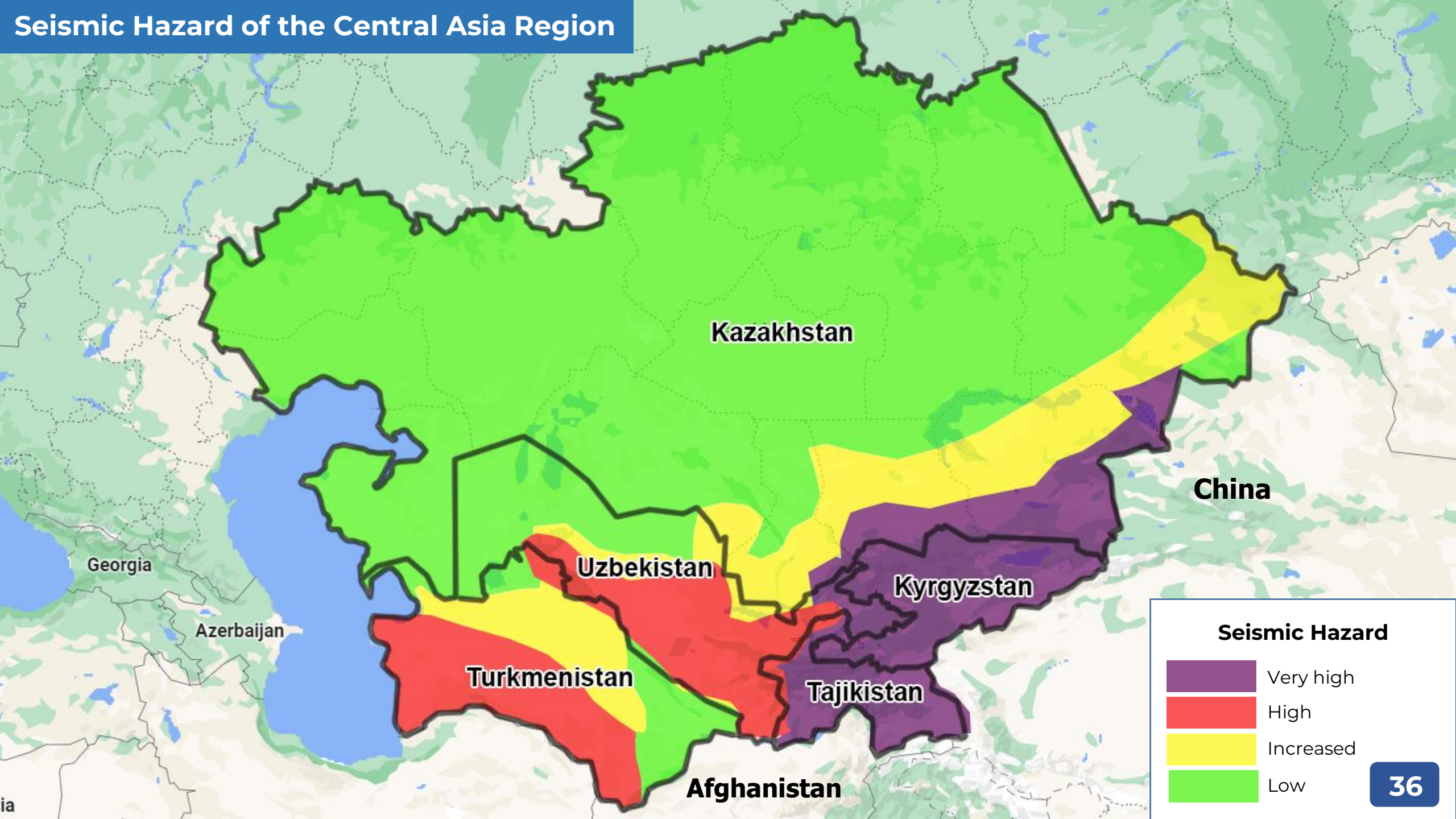
UNDP project: «Creation of a drought response system based on drought monitoring and forecasting».

- Within the project a series of trainings for building stakeholder capacity to practice drought response skills, mitigate drought impacts are conducted and draft documents to strengthen the country's capacity in forecasting and responding to drought are developed.
- The work provides for strengthening the capability of the RSE "Kazhydromet" to improve the efficiency of agrometeorological monitoring and forecasting, the new design of the drought forecast bulletin, taking into account the needs of the main consumers, will not only provide information but also understand and easily interpret for taking appropriate measures.
- In drought response, a coordination mechanism for drought response at the national level and a Drought Response Plan based on a pilot region were developed with the development of standard recommendations for dissemination and use by other regions of Kazakhstan.

THE CENTER'S PRIORITY ACTIVITIES FOR 2023-2024

1. Assistance in further holding the Regional Forum-Meeting of the Head of Emergency Authorities of Central Asian countries.
2. Increasing the number of States Parties of the Center based on the expansion of its membership by providing the Center with the status of the Secretariat of the Civil Protection Mechanism of the Organization of Turkic States.
3. Planning and implementation of practical measures to achieve harmonization of national legislation of States Parties in the field of civil defense in order to bring them into line with generally recognized legal norms and principles of international law.
4. Capacity building of experts and specialists of States Parties by conducting special exercises, trainings and other relevant activities.
5. Improvement of the life safety for the population of States Parties from natural and man-made disasters using innovative information and communication technologies (UAVs, GIS systems, Remote Sensing etc.)
6. Attraction of investments of international and non-governmental organizations (donors) to develop and implement joint international projects and initiatives in DRR.
7. Creation of a Regional system of early warning and mutual notification of transboundary disaster risks.
8. Creation on the basis of the Center of the Regional Coordination Center for disaster response in the Central Asian countries
